Registration and Tuition Payment

The MBA Office will register you for your fall 2014 classes by early August. Fall 2014 Tuition bills are prepared once you are registered. An email will be sent to your official University e-mail account announcing that the eBill is available to review and/or pay **but only after** you activate your Penn State Access Account. The due date is approximately 2-3 weeks from the date the bill is prepared. Complete details can be found on the [Bursar's website](#).

Note: The \$1,000 tuition deposit will be credited to your account after you begin the program. Do not expect the \$1,000 to appear on your initial semester bill. Typically the credit will be issued by late-September. Additionally you will be assessed program fees in the amount of \$200 (for orientation activities and the communications course) – these fees are also assessed after you begin the program. We make every attempt to coordinate the post of the \$200 in conjunction with the \$1,000 deposit credit.

Parking Information

The [University Office of Parking](#) will open online parking registration on August 18, 2014. If you require parking for the first week of Orientation, you must go to the Parking Office located in the Eisenhower Parking Deck at 7:30AM on August 11 to obtain a week-long temporary parking pass. Temporary passes cost just \$5 for the week. Once registration opens on August 18 for permanent passes, you can then register your vehicle and print a paper version of your pass to use until your official parking permit arrives in the mail. Please [visit the site](#) to understand the policies and regulations for parking on-campus. Once your car is registered with the Parking Office you will need to park in the designated lot during orientation activities. If you do not have a car or have not registered it with the Parking Office, it is highly recommended that you utilize public transportation services from your residence during the two-week orientation session. [CATA](#) is the public transportation provider in the Centre Region. Other options include parking in the [municipal parking lots downtown](#) and walking to campus or using the local CATA bus system.
